The majority of activity conducted by Sudo Room (60%) is intended to provide a safe, accessible educational space for formal and informal learning. Sudo Room members maintain and provide access to shared equipment located in Sudo Room or spaces otherwise legally permitted for use by Sudo Room, its volunteers, their guests, and any other organizations established for public benefit and having a sufficiently compatible mission to warrant use of Sudo Room provides a platform for sharing knowledge related to these projects with others. Providing public access to said space 24 hours a day, 7 days a week is the default activity of Sudo Room, unless one or more of the following activities described herein are previously scheduled and prevent workspace utilization. The use of tools and other resources available to anyone executing independent science and technology related projects is permitted without formal procedure prior to beginning work so long as said projects are not in conflict with Sudo Room's mission, and proper permitting and consent is given for any activity requiring such permission.

Educational classes and workshops comprise approximately 20% of Sudo Room's activities, led by Sudo Room members or invited instructors, held at Sudo Room or spaces otherwise legally permitted for use by Sudo Room, its volunteers, their guests, and any other organizations established for public benefit and having a sufficiently compatible mission to warrant use of Sudo Room resources. Such classes and workshops are intended to provide a free platform for anyone to share knowledge on topics of mutual interest in a safe, clean environment, in the sole interest of educating the community and each other. Examples of past classes include: programming, mathematics, arts, crafts, bike maintenance, crypto-currency, privacy advocacy, leatherworking, 3-D modeling and printing, electronics, soldering, and computer literacy. Classes are held periodically and scheduled based on interest in the local community and the availability of volunteering instructors on a weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis.

Furthermore, Sudo Room facilitates recurring and non-recurring meetings which comprise approximately 20% of Sudo Room's activities, scheduled based on interest of attendees and the availability of meeting facilitators on a weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis, organized by Sudo Room volunteers and other community-oriented groups sponsored by Sudo Room members related to the development and execution of projects benefitting the public while advancing specific areas of knowledge within the scope of Sudo Room's mission. Meetings take place within Sudo Room or spaces otherwise legally permitted for use by Sudo Room, its volunteers, their guests, and any other organizations established for public benefit and having a sufficiently compatible mission to warrant use of Sudo Room resources. Requests for hosting of specific activities requiring exclusive use of the Sudo Room space or other Sudo Room resources may be made by community members subject to approval by other members on a weekly basis. Examples of meetings include the topics of public policy, public school partnerships and involvement, mental health, support for the previously incarcerated, privacy and security technology lectures, civic technology meetups, nonprofit advocacy, book and poetry readings, city governance candidates meet and greets, as well as touring lecturers from around the world.
