More About Critical Resistance's Impact:

Through advancing a critical understanding of the prison industrial complex (PIC) and PIC abolition, CR has continued to inspire individuals, organizations, and communities to take creative and practical steps to build a liberated future. With our movement partners and coalitions, we have achieved many victories in our chapter cities and nationally over the years. Most recently, in 2020, CR Portland achieved the dismantling of the gang enforcement, transit, and school police units of the Portland Police Bureau with the Care Not Cops campaign and coalition, and CR Oakland secured the closure of a toxic jail in San Francisco

with the No New San Francisco Jail Coalition. Over the past 20 years, we have also successfully stopped the construction of new jails in Los Angeles, San Francisco, and New York City; halted California's prison building boom with the Stop Delano II campaign, abolished the world's largest SWAT training program known as Urban Shield, organized with the successful prisoner-led struggle to end long-term solitary confinement in California, and eliminated racist gang injunctions in Oakland, to name a few highlights of our organizing with movement partners.

Our campaigns and strategies have been shared and used as blueprints across the US, invigorating the mainstream criminal justice reform movement with abolition and arming organizers with practical and visionary concepts, strategies, and language. Our educational materials and workshops have been used by thousands of organizers locally, regionally, and internationally, influencing educators, faith groups and leaders, health workers and public health advocates, labor organizers, legal organizations, and internationalist community groups to fight against the harms of imprisonment and policing.

The core of Critical Resistance's work is to push—through grassroots mobilizations, popular education, campaigns, and coalition efforts—a reinvigorated abolitionist common sense in which the key to health and safety is not policing, imprisonment, or state violence, but healing, stability, and liberation.
